## Trophy Season April 15 - to- May 15

During the 2017 trophy season, anglers were allowed one fish per person per day at a minimum size limit of 35 inches total length.

The catch per angler trip of striped bass during the trophy season, as estimated by the spring creel survey, was low overall. Only 19 striped bass from 10 fishing trips were reported to the volunteer angler survey during the 2017 trophy season.

Lengths of striped bass reported ranged from 10-36.5 inches. Bottom fishing, casting and jigging were methods used by anglers reporting striped bass during the trophy season in addition to trolling.

## Summer/Fall Season


May 16 -to- Dec. 20

During the 2017 summer/fall season, anglers were allowed two fish per person per day at a minimum size limit of 20 inches total length, and only one fish 28 inches total length or greater.

The average size of striped bass harvested in the summer/fall season was

**24.0 INCHES** 

38 percent of the fish reported had a total length greater or equal to 20 inches.
