

Grass Carp

Ctenopharyngodon idella


Identification

Large, torpedo-shaped fish; large, clearly-defined scales.

Why is it a Problem?

Consumes native aquatic vegetation; competes with native species for food; degrades water quality by increasing phosphorous levels; interferes with native fish reproduction.

Range/Habitat

Last seen in small ponds in the Potomac, Patuxent, Choptank, and Nanticoke basins.

Similar Species Very similar in appearance to

the black carp (also invasive).

Legal Status Prohibited from import,

transport, sale, purchase and possession in Maryland.

Method of Hitchi Introduction aquac

Hitchhiked into Maryland via aquaculture and intentional

release.

Control and

Do not release live grass carp

Prevention into Maryland waters.
