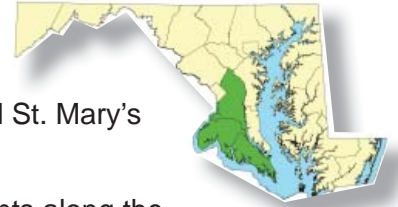


The Lower Potomac River Water Trail

AT A GLANCE

Primary Waterway: The Lower Potomac River.



Location: Prince George's, Charles, and St. Mary's Counties in Southern Maryland.

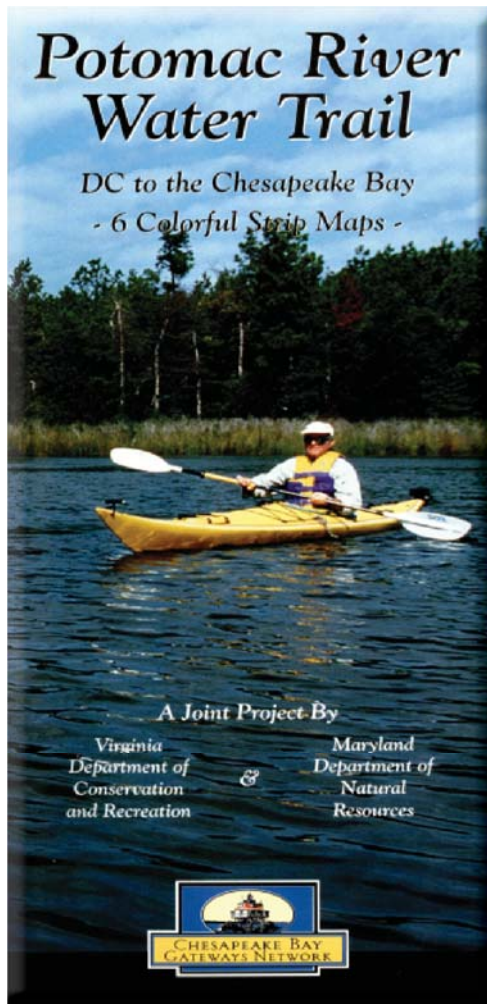
Trail: This map set highlights access points along the southern reaches of the Potomac River in both Maryland and Virginia.

Start Point and End Point: The trail begins in Washington D.C. and ends at Point Lookout State Park, Maryland.

Distance: Approximately 100 miles.

Trail Features: The lower portion of the Potomac River passes through a landscape rich with history, before flowing into the Chesapeake Bay. Historic Alexandria, Mt. Vernon, George Washington's Birthplace, Robert E. Lee's family home, and Point Lookout are some of the many sites featured on this water trail. Along the way, experience the Potomac's natural areas and wildlife, and parts of the region that seem little changed from earlier times.

The Lower Potomac Water Trail map set includes information on each access point, including the availability of restrooms, boating facilities, historical interest, overnight accommodations, camping and food service. The six water trail maps also include GPS (Global Positioning System) information on access sites as well as boating safety tips and emergency phone numbers.



Smallwood State Park, Chapel Point State Park, and Point Lookout State Park are featured in this water trail. The map also features information about paddling and boating safety, wildlife viewing ethics, Leave No Trace ethics (more information at www.lnt.org), and other information that is essential to trips to this area.

Other water trails in Southern Maryland: Charles County, Point Lookout, and the Kingfisher Canoe Trail.
