

Prime Working Waterfronts* (81 points)

- ▲ Prime Working Waterfronts that Support Commercial Fishing
- ▲ Prime Working Waterfronts that Do Not Support Commercial Fishing

▲ Other Access Points (1,474 points)

*Prime Working Waterfronts are those points that have adequate parking, all-tide access, and on-site fuel availability
