You must clearly indicate harvest activity (or no harvest) for each clam species you declared for.

- The DNR needs this information to determine the number of clams being harvested from the Bay and where those clams are coming from. This is also a federal Shellfish Sanitation (NSSP) requirement.
- Please use a separate form for each type of clam harvested; non-harvested species can be on the same form as long as you clearly indicate which type of clams you are reporting for. You must indicate the clam species for which you declared on the form even if you are reporting “No Harvest.”
- Forms that do not have every column filled out will not be accepted and will be returned to you.
- Please be as specific as possible when referring to river or creek names. Use the State of Maryland Shellfish Closure Areas Book to report areas (chart name), especially if you are not sure of your exact location.
- Remember to record the number of crew (not counting yourself) and the total number of hours worked because this information is no longer required on the buy ticket.
- Always write the buyer license number of whom you sold your clams to (or crabbers for bait).
