Reptile Encounter

11 a.m. -3 p.m. at the Nature Center

Reptiles play a vital role in the ecology of our natural world. Join us to learn more and get the chance to see a live corn snake.

Patuxent River Formation

10 a.m. – 4 p.m. at the Nature Center

Guided Hikes at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.

Discover the natural forces that shaped the upper Patuxent River valley. Using a stream table, we'll demonstrate how water and erosion have sculpted this unique landscape over time. Then, join us for a guided hike along the river to observe these features in person and see how the valley continues to evolve. Bring water shoes and be prepared to get wet!

Foxes and Coyotes: Canines of the Park 10 a.m. -2 p.m. at the Nature Center

Discover the fascinating world of two clever park residents—foxes and coyotes. Learn about their behavior, characteristics, and how they compare by examining real pelts, skulls, and teeth. Explore what makes each of these canines unique and how they thrive in our local ecosystem.

Water Mills in Patuxent River State Park 10 a.m. -2 p.m. at the Nature Center

The upper Patuxent River's geography made it an ideal location for waterpowered mills in the 18th and 19th centuries. These mills played a vital role in local farming communities—grinding grain, cutting lumber, and more. Stop by the exhibit to explore the history of these mills within the park and surrounding areas. History of the Upper Patuxent River Valley 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. at the Nature Center Guided Hikes at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.

Explore how the geology of the Patuxent River valley influenced early settlement and community development. Learn about the area's rich history—from its natural foundations to its colonial and post-colonial past. During guided hikes, we'll visit historical sites near the Nature Center, including the former Freedmen's community and Howard Chapel Cemetery.

Dragonflies and Damselflies – Aerial Acrobats 10 a.m. – 2 p.m. at the Nature Center

Dragonflies and damselflies are dazzling sights throughout the summer! But how can you tell them apart? What important roles do they play in the ecosystem? Visit the Nature Center to discover the answers and explore the world of these incredible aerial acrobats. While you're here, create a fun, take-home dragonfly craft!

Fern Valley Hike

1 p.m. at the Nature Center

Join a volunteer ranger for a guided hike along the park's scenic Red Trail, including a visit to "Fern Valley"—a lush area rich with native ferns. Along the 3.7-mile round trip, you'll learn about the various fern species found in the park and enjoy a refreshing woodland walk. The trail includes two small creek crossings and varied terrain. Please wear sturdy walking shoes and bring water.

Nature Crafts – Duck Foot Simulator 10:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. at the Nature Center

We're hoping for a hot day! Learn how ducks use their webbed feet to swim, then step into a small pool and try it out yourself using webbed swimming gloves. Expect to get splashed—but not soaked—as you discover how it feels to paddle like a duck.
