This week-long teacher professional development course for middle and high school teachers explores Climate Change through the use of National Estuarine Research Reserve System (NERRS) and NOAA data and curriculum, field experiences to Reserve sites, and classroom materials.

Through hands-on, field-based investigations teachers will have the opportunity to gather authentic data, analyze that data, and ultimately use this information to develop action projects that will have a positive impact on the natural systems of the Chesapeake Bay.
