.06 Devices for Hunting Wetland Game Birds.

- F. The restriction in §E *of this regulation* that limits shotguns to those holding not more than three shells does not apply to: [shotguns used for hunting snow geese and resident Canada geese if these methods are permitted in Maryland according to a Final Rule adopted by the Department of the Interior, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, as published in the Federal Register pursuant to 50 CFR 20.]
 - (1) Shotguns used for hunting snow geese during the Light Goose Conservation Order season; and
 - (2) Shotguns used for hunting resident Canada geese during the September resident Canada goose season.

.07 Areas Open to Offshore Waterfowl Hunting.

- A. [A] Consistent with a final rule published in the Federal Register pursuant to 50 CFR 20, except as provided in \$C of this regulation, a person may hunt migratory waterfowl from a boat or floating blind which is anchored, drifting, sculled, or paddled, or while standing in the water on the natural bottom in those open areas described [as follows:] in \$B of this regulation.
 - B. The following areas are open:
 - (1)–(8) (text unchanged)
- C. In the sea duck shooting zone described in .04 of this chapter, sea ducks (scoters, long-tailed duck, and eiders) may only be taken during the dates of the special sea duck season.
 - [B.] D. A person hunting wild waterfowl in the offshore hunting zone shall remain at least:
- (1) 800 yards from any shore including shore emerging at mean low water, except in the following waters, where a person hunting wild waterfowl shall remain at least 400 yards from shore including shore emerging at mean low water:
- (a) Chesapeake Bay located in Baltimore, Harford, and St. Mary's counties as described in $\S A(1) \S B(1)$ of this regulation;
 - (b) Potomac River as described in [$\S A$] $\S B(2)$ of this regulation;
 - (c) Susquehanna Flats as described in [$\S A$] $\S B(3)$ of this regulation; and
 - (d) Dorchester, Somerset and Wicomico counties as described in [\$A(6)-(7)] \$B(6)-(7) of this regulation.
