

BUTTERFLIES OF MARYLAND: A BIOLOGICAL SUMMARY AND CHECKLIST

Notes: **Occurrence Level (OL) and State Range:** Rare (R), Uncommon (U), Common (C), Historical (H - not found for many years in indicated region(s) and probably no longer resident there), Extirpated (X - not found for many years and probably no longer resident in state), Wanderer (W - known to regularly immigrate into MD or indicated region(s) but unlikely to be an established breeder there), Stray (S - originating far from and not native to MD or indicated region(s) of record and probably a stray), Potential (P - occurs near MD), Accidental (A - unlikely even as a stray, probably accidentally introduced). **State Range:** Appalachian Plateau (AP), Ridge & Valley (RV), Piedmont (PD), Upper Coastal Plain (UC), Lower Coastal Plain (LC), or Coastal Plain (CP).
