Rock snot is an invasive algae that impacts our fisheries. When introduced to a new habitat, plants, parasites and animals negatively impact our natural resources.

Remember that water-based activities like angling, boating and jet skis can transport aquatic invasive species.

This means that your favorite activities play a role in prevention.

There are **four easy steps** you can take to help prevent the spread of aquatic invasives.

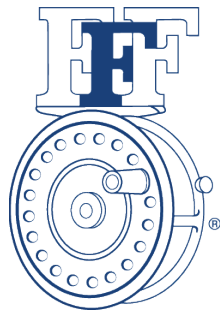
1. **Remove** all dirt, plants and other materials from your gear before you leave a body of water
2. **Rinse** your gear with clean water
3. Thoroughly **dry** your gear
4. **Never transport** plants or animals from one body of water to another
