Barriers Identified

• Viewed as a mans sport



- Lack of female role models or information
- Raised in a non-hunting family
- Image of sport as portrayed by the anti hunting movement
- Expense of availability of suitable equipment for women









Strategies

- •Educational opportunities for women
- •Promote outdoor activities for all.
- •Encourage clothing and equipment manufacturers to develop lines for women
- •Promote activities through the media







Results

- The first *Becoming an Outdoors-Woman (BOW)* workshop 1991 in Wisconsin
- Today over 40 states and several Canadian provinces offer BOW workshops
- Maryland began hosting BOW workshops in 1995

The Workshops

- Variety of activities balanced between hunting/shooting, fishing, non-consumptive sports
- 100 participants
- Four classes throughout weekend (~40 classes)
- Classes designed to be hands-on







Beyond BOW Workshops

- One or two day events on specific topics
- Limited participants











Barrier identified in Maryland

- Family obligation/small children
- No one to go with
- Not comfortable in the outdoor
- Equipment (lack of or cost)
- Physical ability
- Not confident enough
- Intimidation/fear
- Motivation






What we learned over the 30 Years of BOW

- Increase in license sales
















Where Participants Live
