


MANUMISSION OF GEORGE ENOCH HOWARD

At the request of George Howard the following manumission was recorded the first day of April, 1851. To wit: To all whom it may concern, be it known that I, Sarah Griffith of Montgomery County in the State of Maryland, for diverse good causes and considerations me thereunto moving, have released form slavery, manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit, and set free my negro named George Howard being of the age of thirty six years and able to work and maintain gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and him, the said negro man named George Howrd, I do declare to be henceforth free, manumitted and discharged from all manner of service or servitude to me, my executors and administrators forever. In witness whereof I hereunto subscribe my name and offer my seal this thirty first day of March, eighteen hundred and fifty one.




As well as the ruins of the former Great House, Locust Villa

...back into a beautiful, respectful Place of Rest.






After CJC was done, Maryland Historic Trust came along... with Ground Penetrating Radar

What's next... Great Maryland Outdoors Act

(Senate Bill 541)

AN ACT concerning

Natural Resources - Maryland Park Service and State Parks - Alterations (Great Maryland Outdoors Act)





Freedman's State Historical Park

(B) (C) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH THE FREEDMAN'S STATE HISTORICAL PARK AS A PARTNERSHIP PARK THAT SEEKS TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC ABOUT AND PRESERVE AND INTERPRET THE LIVES AND EXPERIENCES OF BLACK AMERICANS BOTH BEFORE AND AFTER THE ABOLITION OF SLAVERY.

(2) FREEDMAN'S STATE HISTORICAL PARK SHALL BE HELD BY THE STATE AS A STATE PARK UNDER THE PROTECTION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT.

(C) (D) THE PARK FREEDMAN'S STATE HISTORICAL PARK SHALL CONSIST OF PROPERTIES IN NORTHEASTERN MONTGOMERY COUNTY IN OR NEAR THE COMMUNITIES OF BROOKEVILLE, OLNEY, SANDY SPRING, ZION, AND LAYTONSVILLE THAT ARE:

(1) OWNED BY THE STATE AND DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT AS PART OF THE PARK; AND


(2) (I) OWNED BY A LOCAL GOVERNMENT, A BICOUNTY AGENCY, OR A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION; AND

(II) DESIGNATED AS PART OF THE PARK BY A PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE OWNER OF THE PROPERTY AND THE STATE.
