BACKGROUND

Vessel Day Off

- The action proposes to amend Regulation .14 under COMAR 08.02.03 Blue Crabs
- Purpose: modifying the commercial crabbing day off rules in the Chesapeake Bay and its tidal tributaries to 1) allow a vessel to be used on the day the owner of the vessel has declared off and 2) no longer require a licensee's day off to be displayed on the vessel

PROPOSAL DETAILS

Regulation .14 – Vessel Day Off

- Requires individual crabbers to declare a day off (either Sunday or Monday) and display that day on their vessel
- Vessel cannot be used on owner's day off
- When a vessel is shared by two licensees, current rule requires both licensees to take the same day off
- This action allows licensees to take the day off they prefer while still being able to crab six days per week
- Natural Resource Police have access to licensing system to confirm which day off a licensee has declared
