# In Need of Conservation — Housekeeping

# What is being considered?

The Department is considering changing the word conversation to conservation in COMAR 08.02.12.01B(2)(c) to avoid confusion in regulation due to a clerical error. This is a housekeeping issue with a definition. The text being corrected is below.

- (2) "Species in need of conservation" means any species which:
  - (a) May become threatened in the foreseeable future;
  - (b) Has a limited or declining population; and
  - (c) Has been determined by the Secretary to be in need of <u>conversation</u> measures for its continued ability to sustain itself successfully.

# Why is this change necessary?

This action is necessary to prevent the public from misunderstanding the intent of the regulation because the wrong word was used.

#### Who will this affect?

This change does not affect anyone directly since it is a spelling correction.

#### When will this be effective?

The Department projects that this change could be effective in the winter of 2024-2025. However, the exact date cannot be determined. The Department will follow our normal proposal procedures if this concept moves forward.

### **Definitions**

"Conserve" means to use all methods and procedures for the purpose of increasing the number of individuals within a species or population up to the optimum carrying capacity of their habitat and maintaining these levels.

### What is the specific regulatory action?

Amend Regulation .01 under COMAR 08.02.12 Endangered and Threatened Fish Species.

## Has this change been discussed with advisory bodies?

This idea was scoped with the Sport Fisheries Advisory Commission and the Tidal Fisheries Advisory Commission at their meetings in July 2024.
