

Obey the Law. Catch the Crabs. **Save the Turtles.**

Use Turtle Reduction Devices (TRD) **It's the Law***



The diamondback terrapin is Maryland's state reptile, our state university mascot, and the only turtle that lives its entire life in the brackish tidal waters of the Chesapeake Bay.

The TRD is easy to install and allows crabs to enter the pot but prevents most diamondback terrapins from entering. **Turtles and other animals that enter crab pots without a TRD cannot escape from the pot and will drown.**

In Maryland, the TRD opening must be no larger than 1.75" x 4.75".

Crab pots used by waterfront property owners in Maryland must be:

1. Fitted with a Turtle Reduction Device (TRD) in **every** entry funnel.
2. Marked with the owner's name and address or DNRid.
