Old Business

Review of Minutes:

FOR 101 Camp:

Juls was not present to provide a recap of FOR 101 camp so this item was tabled for the next meeting.

NRCC:

Brad and Marie provided a summary of their time at NRCC. Brad stated that is was a good group of students who seemed very attentive. Marie said that enrollment was a little low at camp but overall the week went very well. All speakers provided excellent programs and there were no major issues. Will Williams assisted Gabrielle Oldham as the camp assistant director because Gabrielle had indicated that this may be her last year. That is still to be decided. Marie indicated that there may be some minor curriculum changes in the works for next camp.

Smokey's Reading Challenge:

Smokey's reading challenge was not executed this summer, partially due to lack of participation by Rocky Gap State Park who had agreed to partner for the event. Marie still wants to pursue the reading challenge in some capacity and Brad will provide a new contact with the library system. Champ suggested 5th grade outdoor school as a great place to share the reading challenge. Marie will provide Champ with information on the challenge ASAP (outdoor school begins next week). Discussion on the high school art contest was tabled to the next meeting with more people in attendance.

Liberty Tree:

Champ provided a liberty tree update and he has been very busy! He met with MD 250 and they had plenty of ideas related to the Liberty Tree program including potential funding opportunities for NRCC and planting Liberty Trees in prestigious places. Champ is receiving many requests for Liberty Trees and Information. He acknowledged Sherry Frick for helping generate the first ever Liberty Tree Sales. Champ plans to hire Davey Tree to assist in collecting seed from the Liberty Tree again this fall. Board members inquired about the stability and longevity of the relationship with St. John's College and suggested formalizing the relationship or at least honoring the college for their contributions. Champ informed the group of his plans to travel the route marched from Oldtown to Boston by Cresap's Riflemen for the MD 250 Sesquicentennial and plant liberty trees along the way.
