Catoctin Land Trust facilitated the sale of 668 acres to the State of Maryland to become part of Cunningham Falls State Park. For two years, David assisted the family who wished to preserve their family legacy by transferring their family land to the state. This addition to Maryland state parks marks one of the largest acquisitions in a generation and permanently preserves a trout stream and the ecologically sensitive Black Rock special management area. David Lillard has played a critical role in the Heart of Maryland Collaborative.		
Meg Boyd, Howard County Conservancy Meg Boyd partnered with community groups in Howard County to successfully launch a land conservation program for non-profits. The program was funded with a \$2,000,000 grant from Howard County Government toward the purchase of easements and the development of the program. The program was renewed for two additional years, with total funding for the purchase of easements at \$3.5 million. The program was recognized by the National Association of Counties with an Innovation in Conservation Programming award in 2024. Meg Boyd has played a critical role in Conservancy preservation efforts over the 17 years she has led the organization.	Howard	\$2,500

Grants through the <u>Keep Maryland Beautiful program</u> are awarded to volunteer-based and nonprofit groups, communities, schools, and land trusts in Maryland. The grants are designed to support environmental education projects, litter removal, community stewardship, and to help protect natural resources in urban and rural areas.

Presented annually since 1986, the grant program is managed by the Maryland Environmental Trust – a unit of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources – and administered on the department's behalf by the Chesapeake Bay Trust. The grants are funded by the Maryland Environmental Trust, Maryland Department of Transportation, and the Maryland Department of Agriculture.
