Five Million Trees

Established by HB 991, Tree Solutions Now Act, in 2021

5 Million Trees by 2031

- ➤ Additional to tree planting projected in 2019 Greenhouse Gas Reduction Act Draft Plan (current programs)
- Native trees
- Funding started July 1, 2022, \$15 million/year



Rural: New Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program signing bonus, up to \$1,000/acre for new riparian forest buffers

Urban: 10% to underserved areas

 Chesapeake Bay Trust new Urban Forestry Program (\$10 million annually in grants)



10% to Underserved Urban Areas

500,000 trees to Underserved Areas



Prioritize local organizations for grant awards



Statewide Coordination

- Maryland Department of the Environment
 - 5 Million Trees Program Coordinator tracking (with TMDL, GGRA)
 - Commission for the Innovation and Advancement of Carbon Markets and Sustainable Tree Plantings
- Department of Natural Resources
 - 13 Contractor Positions
 - Trust Fund support for tree planting
- Chesapeake Bay Trust
 - Urban Forestry Program
 - Grants for trees to Underserved Areas
- Maryland Department of Agriculture
 - CREP forest buffer signing bonuses





Eligible Costs

- Site preparation
- ➤ Labor
- > Planting materials
- > Maintenance
- Landowner incentives or signing bonuses



DNR's Role in Maryland's 5 Million Trees Effort

- ➤ Provide **technical assistance** for growing 5 million trees
- Expand tree seedling supply at Ayton State Nursery
- Increase capacity of existing tree planting programs
- Create new planting programs that complement existing programs- gap fillers
- Build community of care for growing trees to maturity maintenance
- Leverage state investments with new partners and markets to expand outreach and funding
- Coordinate with partners





Growing Maintenance Strategies

- Expanding volunteer opportunities
 - New Maryland Tree Stewards Program (w/ACB)
 - Riparian Rangers training held in MD (ACB)
 - College volunteer groups held spring & fall events
- Contracting Regional Tree Care Crews
 - Regionally contracted, seeking to attract investment in starting or expanding a tree business
 - Private land management capacity in invasive species control and tree care
- Link to workforce development and natural resource career pathways





Existing Planting Programs/Opportunities-Rural

Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP)

➤ HB 991 adds \$1,000 per acre bonus for new forest buffers

Healthy Forest, Healthy Waters

- ➤ Partnership of Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay, Maryland Forestry Foundation, & MD Forest Service technical support
- ➤ Chesapeake and Coastal Bays Trust Fund

Woodland Incentive Program (WIP)

- ➤ Forest management cost-share program includes tree planting
- ➤ Administered by Maryland Forest Service

Other federal programs

- ➤ Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)
- ➤ Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP)
- ➤ IRA Urban and Community Funding


