She is a founding partner and has directed the Maryland Coastal Bays Program's innovative Coastal Stewards program and the annual youth summit, "Get Out. Get Green. Get Paid." She has partnered with numerous agencies and organizations on national and regional efforts working to nurture a new generation of environmental stewards. Carrie has been involved in the National Environmental Education (EE) Capacity Building project, the Maryland and Delaware Climate Education Assessment and Research project (MADE-CLEAR), is on the team of Maryland contacts for Richard Louv's grassroots Children & Nature Network, serves as a member of the Advisory Board for Outdoor Afro, and is assisting the SESYNC Civic Ecology and Resiliency international project identifying best practices for community empowerment for leadership. She has worked extensively on developing strategies for working with communities of color on the rural Eastern Shore of Maryland, and finds every opportunity to get outdoors with local young people and her own daughter, to go birding, hiking, participate in conservation efforts, or snap photos of her wonderful natural surroundings.


