Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is a native plant?

A: A native plant is a plant that has occurred naturally in a region, ecosystem, or habitat without human introduction.

Q: What is a Latin name?

A: It is a way for botanists, gardeners, horticulturists, and more, to formally name a plant. A Latin name has two parts – *Genus* and *species*. For example, the common name for the Maryland State Flower is Black-eyed Susan. The Latin name is *Rudbeckia hirta*. The genus is *Rudbeckia* and the species is *hirta*; together they make the Latin name.

Q: What is a pollinator?

A: A pollinator is an animal that moves pollen from one flower to another. This allows the flowers to produce fruit, and eventually seeds, ensuring that they can carry on to the next generation. Pollinators can be bees, birds, bats, moths, beetles, and more. While traveling from plant to plant, these pollinators are searching for food (nectar, pollen, other insects), mates, shelter, and nest building material.

Q: How can I help pollinators?

A: Add native plants to your yard or garden!
