2020-2021 HUNTING AT TUCKAHOE STATE PARK

Approximately 1,000 acres of woodlands and fields have been designated for forest game, upland game, dove, waterfowl (lottery only), and deer hunting at Tuckahoe State Park. Hunting is allowed Monday thru Saturday in designated areas only, one (1) hour before sunrise until one (1) hour after sunset. Hunters must comply with all state and federal game laws, as well as Maryland Park Service regulations.

Hunters must sign in to hunt before entering the hunting area daily and SIGN OUT upon leaving. The hunter's sign-in box is located on the outside of the gate at the maintenance facility on the corner of Crouse Mill and Eveland Roads. Trapping is not allowed.

The map on the reverse outlines the approximate boundaries of the hunting area. It is important to note that hunting is not permitted within 150 yards of a dwelling, public road or adjacent property line. Please respect these safety zones. No weapons, loaded or unloaded, are allowed in the 500 acres of the Adkins Arboretum.

Firearms are allowed during all legal hunting seasons; however breech-loading rifles may not be used to hunt deer in Queen Anne's County. See the 2020-2021 Maryland Guide to Hunting and Trapping for season specifications. During this time, firearms may be carried across closed sections of the park in order to reach open hunting land, provided the weapon is unloaded. Firearms are prohibited in all areas during the remainder of the year.

Use of game shooting stands is limited to those of a temporary nature which can be removed at the end of the day. Use of vehicles within the confines of the designated hunting area is prohibited except on public highways and at approved parking areas. Tuckahoe State Park has two (2) disabled hunter access areas available (see reverse).

Bobwhite quail hunting is prohibited at Tuckahoe State Park. This closure, combined with recent habitat improvements, will give the population a chance to recover from previous low numbers.

Permits are required for falconry and dog training and can be obtained at the park office, Monday thru Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

MIGRATORY CANADA GOOSE HUNTING: Four (4) field pits are available by lottery permit only. Applications can be found starting the first Tuesday after Labor Day at www.dnr.maryland.gov/publiclands/Pages/eastern/tuckahoe.aspx. Snow goose hunting is available after the Canada goose season ends on a first-come, first-served basis.
