General Hunting Regulations Tuckahoe State Park



Tuckahoe State Park offers approximately 1,000 acres of woodlands designated for forest game, upland game, Canada Goose (lottery only), and deer hunting. All hunters must strictly adhere to state and federal game laws in addition to Maryland Park Service regulations. **Trapping, Sunday hunting, and nighttime hunting are prohibited.** Vehicles are not permitted within the confines of the park's designated hunting areas except on public roadways, and parking is restricted to designated lots marked on the map. Parking is prohibited within the Greenmount and Sandtown cemeteries. During respective seasons, hunters may carry firearms across closed sections of the park to reach open hunting land, provided their weapons are unloaded. Firearms are prohibited in all areas during the remainder of the year.

Site-Specific Rules & Requirements

- **Sign-In Required:** All hunters must sign in before entering the hunting area and sign out upon leaving. The sign-in bulletin board is located at the park's maintenance facility on the corner of Crouse Mill and Eveland Roads.
- **Safety Zones:** No hunting within 150 yards of any dwelling, public road, or adjacent property line.
- **No weapons, loaded or unloaded, are allowed in the 400 acres of the Adkins Arboretum.**
- **Tree Stands:** Temporary stands only; must be removed at the end of each day.
- **Accessible Hunting:** 2 disabled hunter access areas are available (see map).
- **Contact the park office for information on dog and raptor training; free permits will be provided.**

Goose Hunting

- **Migratory Canada Goose:** Allowed by lottery permit only in 4 field pits/blinds. Apply online.
- **Snow Goose:** First-come, first-served in the field pits/blinds after the Canada Goose season concludes.

Species & Season Closure:

Bobwhite Quail – Closed to allow population recovery following habitat improvements.
