F. Certification Programs

The MPS may require an employee to successfully complete and maintain annual recertification requirements in a specific area based on an assigned job function.	
Only the Park Manager or Program Chief can authorize an employee to allow a certification to lapse due to a change in assignment. Approved elimination of annual recertification requirement must be reported to the MPS Training Division	
Examples of Certifications	
Wildlife Control Firearms	Successful completion of classroom portion of firearms instruction prior to first time range qualification. Annual classroom in-service required. Successful completion of range qualification course. Annual recertification required.
Project Wet, Wild and Learning Tree Facilitator	No Annual Recertification required.

Wildland Firefighter	Requires annual pack test
NAI Certified Interpretive Trainer	Requires renewal (monetary)
Leave No Trace Trainer	Multiple levels – No Annual Recertification required
Hunter and Boater Safety Instructor	May require the facilitation of classes to maintain certification
NRA Firearms Instructor	Requires renewal every 2 years - monetary
Historic Weapons Safety Officer	Training required every two years. Instructors update every three years with the National Park Service
Pesticide Applicator ( Public Lands)	Certified – Annual renewal and Ceu requirement by MDA Registered – Annual renewal ( Must work under a Certified Applicator
Traffic Direction Instructor	No Annual Recertification required
Red Cross Basic Water Safety Instructor	Certification renewal required
Red Cross Small Craft Instructor	Certification renewal required
Red Cross Lifeguard Instructor	Certification renewal required
Red Cross Lifeguard	Certification renewal required
EMS Instructor	Requires annual renewal training

G. Electives – Career Relevant Training

- Electives must be approved by the MPS Training Division in advance of the training
- Approved electives may be completed as an in-service class or an out-of –service class.

H. Professional Development

Employees may be required to complete additional training based on promotion to supervisory level positions.

Supervisor Training coaching is currently required for all new supervisory employees within 1 year of promotion.
