

## **Black Carp** Mylopharynodon piceus

Identification	Large, long fish; pointed snout, large scales
Why is it a Problem?	Generally feeds on snails and shellfish; considered to be a serious threat to mollusks native to the U.S., many of which are critically endangered.



Range/Habitat

Native to Asia, Black Carp have recently been found in the Mississippi Basin. None have been found in Maryland.
