.02 Shipping Creek.

Shipping Creek encompasses the area beginning at a point at or near [Lat. 38° 54.905' N., Long. 76° 20.585' W., then running 114° (True) to a point, at or near Lat. 38° 54.865' N., Long. 76° 20.468' W.,] *Lat. 38° 54.753' N., Long. 76° 20.583' W., then running 116° (True) to a point at or near Lat. 38° 54.693' N., Long. 76° 20.421' W.,* and running to the head of the creek. This area has a 6-knot speed limit Saturdays, Sundays, and State holidays, during the boating season.
