1. Bathing Beach Zones
(a) North Zone:

All of the waters of the Chesapeake Bay offshore of Sandy Point State Park enclosed by a line beginning at a point at the shore near the west end of the north jetty, at or near Lat. 39° 1.095′ N., Long. 76° 23.810′ W., then running 73° (True) to a point near the east end of the north jetty, at or near Lat. 39° 1.113′ N., Long. 76° 23.736′ W., then running 158° (True) to a point at or near Lat. 39° 0.787′ N., Long. 76° 23.564′ W., then running 264° (True) to a point at the shore of Sandy Point State Park, at or near Lat. 39° 0.777′ N., Long. 76° 23.695′ W., then running northerly along the shore to the point of beginning. Unless otherwise permitted in advance by the Maryland Department of Natural Resources or Maryland Park Service, access to this area is limited to only non-motorized vessels at all times.

#### (b.) South Zone:

All of the waters of the Chesapeake Bay offshore of Sandy Point State Park enclosed by a line beginning at a point at the shore, at or near Lat. 39° 0.747′ N., Long. 76° 23.682′ W., then running 83° (True) to a point, at or near Lat. 39° 0.760′ N., Long. 76° 23.550′ W., then running 158° (True) to a point, at or near Lat. 39° 0.643′ N., Long. 76° 23.488′ W., then running 242° (True) to a point near the south end of the Mezick Pond jetty, at or near Lat. 39° 0.390′ N., Long. 76° 24.107′ W., then running 331° (True) to a point on the shore at the Mezick Pond jetty, at or near Lat. 39° 0.464′ N., Long. 76° 24.161′ W., then running easterly and northerly along the shore to the point of beginning. Unless otherwise permitted in advance by the Maryland Department of Natural Resources or Maryland Park Service, access to this area is limited to only non-motorized vessels at all times.

#### 2. Soft Launch Channel:

Beginning at a point, at or near Lat. 39° 0.760′ N., Long. 76° 23.550′ W., then running 263° (True) to a point on the shore of Sandy Point State Park, at or near Lat. 39° 0.747′ N., Long. 76° 23.682′ W., then running 340° (True) to a point on the shore, at or near Lat. 39° 0.777′ N., Long. 76° 23.695′ W., then running 84° (True) to a point, at or near Lat. 39° 0.787′ N., Long. 76° 23.564′ W., then running 158° (True) to the point of beginning. This area has a 6 knot speed limit at all times.
