Watercress Nasturtium officinale


Distribution - Common in streams and wet areas throughout Chesapeake Bay.

Recognition - A coarse, much branched member of the mustard family with deeply divided compound leaves and a low-growing growth form. Often quite dense in small streams of suitable habitat.

Similar Species - Hydrilla (Hydrilla verticillata), Common Waterweed (Elodea canadensis)

Reproduction - By seed.

Comments - This species is considered a delicacy when young, and is raised commercially in some areas of the country.
